### Lake Asbury Municipal Services Benefit District

Wednesday, August 12, 2009

A workshop convened at 8:00 AM at the Lake Asbury dam to begin Clay County's Lake Asbury Watershed & Flooding Study.

This study was originated by Ronnie Robinson, our County Commissioner, who initiated the study for the watershed & flooding problems on Lake Asbury.

Participants: A) LAMSBD: Carl Kocher and Bob Rumble, who provided the boat for the tour of LA.  
B) Camp, Dresser & Mckee, Inc, (CDM) Jacksonville engineering firm: Greg McGrath, Matt Diamond & Robert Prather.

The LA boat tour was a systematic review of all parts of the lake including fingers. The group paid special attention to all of the "hot" drainage spots

Approximately, 10:30 AM the lake tour of LA ended. The group then drove to Vice Chair, DeAnn Bjornson's home. The group joined her for a boat tour of South Lake Asbury. This tour included areas including fingers and again paying special attention to all "hot" drainage spots.

The group disembarked at the new sand bar created by the erosion of Arthur Moore finger fed by water from Seminole Village. Everyone but DeAnn walked the 700 feet plus filled in finger, plus a short distance beyond the finger bulkhead.

The group found the walk a little dangerous because Bob Rumble fell into a quick sand hole.

The boat tour of SLA ended around 1:00 PM. After a quick lunch, the group minus DeAnn completed a road tour of all three lakes (LA, SLA & LR) including a stop at Lake LARC dam. The tour included observations of drainage issues from Henley Road, Route 218 and Seminole Village.

The group walked the Ed Lowe property on Lake Asbury Dr. His property contains a county retention pond which conveys drainage from Seminole Village some 1100 feet under LA Dr into Lake Ryan.

CDM data gathering included GPS guided photos.

The tour ended approximately 3:30 P M. Before CDM left to tour Seminole Village, we agreed that LAMSBD would provide any data not provided by Clay County Public works. In addition to basic data, the county had provided all photos they had received over the past 12 months.

No other business was conducted.
